Guidelines			
Open Category - We are asking our most experienced and accomplished writers to write their stories to the theme of ' The Response '. We encourage writers to use this as a starting point for their story. The theme can be implied in the story and the words ' The Response ' need not appear in the title or anywhere in the story. Please indicate on the application form if you are entering this category. There is an upper limit of 2,500 words in this category.			
Novice Writers - The entrants can choose any subject matter and may adopt any genre of writing as long as they create a short work of fiction. In order to develop the story properly, it is recommended that a story in the Novice category should be between 700- 1500 words			
New Writers - Entrants may write on either fictional or factual themes. Stories should be between 250 and 500 words .

Screenplay submissions should be between 3 and 5 minutes long (approximately 3-5 pages of dialogue). They should be appropriately presented. Writers may choose their own themes.

Memoir Category

Submissions in the Memoir category should be between 700- 1500 words . The memoir may be autobiographical or focus on the way of life in the past. Younger students may like to write about an important incident in their childhood or adolescence. The memoir should have a title. Judges will be looking for writing that is interesting, thought provoking or entertaining. Entrants may submit up to 2 Memoirs.

Competition Guidelines

The SCC Creative Writing Competition aims to be as inclusive as possible. Recognising that aspiring creative writers and students in City of Dublin ETB come from all walks of life, are all ages and are from many nationalities, we have created three categories of competitors so that all entries may be judged on a level playing field. We ask entrants or their teachers to nominate their category but if we feel that entries would fit better into a different category, we reserve the right to change them. Every effort is made to place work of a similar standard in the same category, so that it can be judged fairly.

Open Writer:

The Open Writer is one with a very high standard of written English. The Open Writer may be an adult with experience of creative writing or a talented young person with creative flair. Open Writing typically has greater complexity of meaning and more fluency of language than the Novice and New categories. For the 2019 competition we ask Open Writers to write to the theme of **'The Response'**. The upper word limit is 2,500 words.

Novice Writer:

A Novice Writer is one with a reasonable standard of written English but may not have much experience in creative writing. This is the category into which most school leavers fall and it is the largest section of the competition. The upper word limit is 1,500 words.

New Writer:

A New Writer is someone new to writing in English. A New Writer might be a student of Adult Literacy or a foreign student with an elementary knowledge of English.

Rules:

The entrant must be a student in a City of Dublin ETB College or Centre. All entrants must be 16 years of age or over and should be in Senior Cycle of secondary school, a PLC course or other course run by a CDETБ College or Centre. Evening School students in Creative Writing classes in CDETБ Colleges are also eligible. All entries must be attached to an official entry form, which may be downloaded from www.sccdublin.ie. A teacher must sign the entry form. The entry must not have been published previously, or have been a prize winner in a previous competition.
